Phase One: Notice of Intention to Appeal Received by <u>Deferred Compensation</u> <u>Board c/o ETF Secretary</u>Department

- 1. <u>The Deferred Compensation Board (Board)</u> authorizes <u>Employee Trust Funds</u> (ETF) staff to issue <u>the "lintent to Aa</u>ward" to the successful bidder.
- ETF staff issue the <u>lintent</u> to <u>Aa</u>ward to the successful bidder and notify all firms who submitted a bid.
- <u>A vVendors who wants wish</u> to appeal the award MUST send a written notice <u>indicating that theythe vendor</u> intends to appeal the decision. <u>The vendor must</u> <u>send the notice</u> to the Board, c/o the Secretary of ETF, within <u>five</u> business days after the <u>lintent to Aa</u>ward notice is sent.
- 4. Upon receiving the written intent to appeal from the vendor, the ETF Secretary will forward the notice to all Board members.

Phase Two: Formal Appeal Received by the Board c/o ETF SecretaryDepartment

- 5. Within 10 days from the issuance of the <u>lintent to Aa</u>ward, the vendor MUST submit the formal appeal in writing to the Board, c/o the Secretary of ETF.
- The appeal must state the contract number, detailed factual grounds for the objection to the contract award, and any <u>violations of Chapter 40, Wisconsin</u> <u>S</u>statutes and administrative codes that were violated.
- 7. <u>The Secretary will forward the formal appeal to the Board.</u>
- 8. If the vendor withdraws the intention to appeal or does not follow up within <u>ten10</u> days with a formal appeal, the ETF Secretary will notify the Board that the matter is adjudicated and no Board action is required.
- 9. The Secretary forwards the formal appeal to the Board.
- **10.9**. All communications and documentation will be maintained with the procurement file.
- 11.<u>10.</u> The ETF Secretary will direct ETF <u>LegalGeneral</u> Counsel and the ETF Director of Procurement to investigate the alleged violation of <u>Chapter 40.the</u> Statutes or Administrative Code.

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12.11. The <u>Secretary will forward the</u> results of the investigation will be forwarded to the Board in writing and include a recommendation to the Board as well as legal and factual support for the recommendation.

Phase Three: Board Decision

13.12. The Board <u>will</u> reviews the appeal and ETF's recommendation.

- 14.13. The Board will renders a decision. For most appeals, the options available to the Board are: rescind the original lintent to Aaward and direct staff to issue the award to a different bidder; rescind the original lintent to Aaward and direct staff to terminate the procurement; or deny the appeal and proceed with implementing the original decision.
- <u>14.</u>Following Board action, a written decision will be sent to the vendor appellant. The vendor appellant is allowed one appeal per procurement contract or process. <u>All Board decisions are considered final.</u>

15. For appeals of procurement awards made under Chapter 40, the Board's decision is final.
