- **SUBJECT:** Secretary's Correction of Error Authority Report to the Employee Trust Funds (ETF) Board

This memorandum is for informational purposes only. No action is required.

The ETF Secretary's Correction of Error Authority was created under Section 40.03(2)(w), Wisconsin Statutes and took effect on August 31, 2001. It allows the Department Secretary to correct certain Departmental errors in order to prevent inequities. The statutory provision reads:

If the secretary determines that an otherwise eligible participant has unintentionally forfeited or otherwise involuntarily ceased to be eligible for any benefit provided under this chapter principally because of an error in administration by the department, may order the correction of the error to prevent inequity. A decision under this paragraph is not subject to review. The secretary shall submit a quarterly report to the employee trust funds board on decisions made under this paragraph.

The table on the following page provides information on a case in 2009 where ETF Secretary Stella exercised his authority to alleviate participant inequities created due to Departmental errors.

As a direct result, he cancelled his retirement benefit application and unintentionally forfeited his spouse's right to the higher death benefit amount available to survivors of participants who die while actively employed.
