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## 2008-2012 AA/EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY (EEO) PLAN

- ETF's AA/EEO Plan is effective from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2017. Plans are underway to develop strategies and projects to meet the goals contained in the AA/EEO plan. One of the primary goals is to increase the minority hires in underutilized job categories. Strategies are being developed to increase outreach to minority populations for these positions and create an increased awareness among managers and supervisors of the positions that are targeted through the underutilization analysis.
- The Department continued its partnership with Lincoln Elementary School, with staff
  volunteering to tutor students during their lunch hours. A new Pen Pal program was also
  started this fall. ETF Pen Pals write to their 5<sup>th</sup> grade pen pal every other week and then
  they receive a response back. This program is designed to help the 5<sup>th</sup> graders with their
  written communication skills. There were more ETF volunteers than students enrolled in
  this program.
- The first week of November ETF launched a "Mittens for School" campaign to provide hats, mittens and scarves to the students at Lincoln Elementary School.
- During the recognition of Constitution Week, the AAC posted daily tidbits to ETF employees, encouraging our staff to consider the freedoms and responsibilities our Constitution and its amendments have given us as citizens of the U.S., employees of ETF and members of this community.
- In October, the AAC sponsored Lunch and Learn speaker Joel Lewis from the Dane County Sheriff's Department to educate staff about individuals who are entered into the program provided by the Huber Center located near the ETF Rimrock Road location. Joel discussed the challenges of gaining employment following incarceration and the benefits to the public in employing these individuals. This set off an extremely successful clothes donation drive for these individuals to use when interviewing for positions.
- A member from the AAC wrote an article for the *ETF Community* website titled "Welcome to a Multicultural America" to discuss diversity and to encourage more staff blogging in the *ETF Community* blog.

#### EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION/APPRECIATION

- Excerpts of letters we receive complimenting staff are posted on the *ETF Community*.
- Jerry Dietzel, Deputy Controller in the Office of Trust Finance, was honored at a gathering in October to celebrate his retirement. Jerry had over 35 years of service with the State of Wisconsin.
- It was announced that nominations are being accepted for the 2<sup>nd</sup> ETF Excellence Award to be given in mid-December. The award recognizes ETF employees who demonstrate a commitment to those we serve by providing excellent customer service through creativity, innovation, warmth, friendliness, individual pride and agency spirit.
- Bosses Day was acknowledged in the Secretary's Office by staff providing a variety of breakfast treats to show their appreciation.

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#### PARTNERS IN GIVING

• Several activities were hosted at both ETF locations to support the Partners in Giving Campaign. Some of those activities included a bake sale, costume contest, garage sale, breakfast event, nacho day and silent/live auctions. The goal for ETF is to raise \$38,000 by the close of the campaign.
