EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE QUARTERLY HUMAN RESOURCES REPORT June 2015

2014-2017 AA/EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY (EEO) PLAN

- ETF's AA/EEO Plan is effective from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2017. Strategies and projects to meet the goals contained in the AA/EEO plan are underway. Several are highlighted in the bullet points below.
- AAC Chair Stefanie Pauls and the Affirmative Action Officer Olga Bilinson provided a
 presentation to the ETF Board of Managers, Board of Supervisors and Board of Leads to
 explain the importance of the AAC and how each of those boards could assist in the
 success of the committee.
- The Department continued its partnership with Lincoln Elementary School, with staff
 volunteering to tutor students during their lunch hours. The new pen pal program
 between ETF employees and students of Lincoln Elementary School came to a close
 with a pizza party sponsored by the ETF staff who participated in the program. Many
 ETF staff and their pen pals met for the first time.
- The Department of Employee Trust Funds, the Wisconsin Deferred Compensation (WDC) Program, and Affirmative Action Committees at several Wisconsin state agencies are sponsoring a statewide educational campaign to inspire and encourage working women of all cultures to save more for their retirement. The campaign, "EMPOWER: Guiding Women of All Cultures Toward a Strong Financial Future," has been kicked off with participation from multiple other agencies. Internal ETF activities have been sponsored to encourage ETF staff to review their readiness for retirement.
- The AAC also sponsored "Lunch & Learn" sessions on topics such as "Discover Eastern Mediterranean Culture through Dana's Big Adventure" and "Cross Cultural Communication".
- The AAC sponsored a drive to raise money for a Lincoln School Scholarship fund. Through very generous donations, ETF raised \$1,211 to donate towards the scholarship.

- Applications for nominations of ETF employees for the ETF Excellence Award have been requested. This is an award established in 2014 to honor employees who demonstrate a commitment to those we serve by providing excellent customer service.
- Kirk Kushava graduated from the Wisconsin Certified Public Manager (CPM) program in March through a ceremony held at the State Capitol Assembly Chambers. The CPM program is an 18-month nationally-accredited management development training program. Kirk's participation was sponsored by ETF.
