- **SUBJECT:** Status of Pending Legal Cases

This memo is for informational purposes only. No Board action is required.

This memorandum presents the status of pending or recently settled legal cases involving insurance issues and the Department of Employee Trust Funds (ETF) and the Group Insurance Board (GIB). In order to maintain Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) member confidentiality, the names of the parties and case numbers are not identified in this memorandum.

The purpose of this memorandum is to inform you of litigation in which the GIB and ETF are parties or are otherwise involved, not to provide any legal advice concerning the cases listed here. Each of the cases is being handled by either an assistant attorney general from the Department of Justice (DOJ) or a private attorney retained by Wisconsin Physicians Service (WPS). If you have any questions about a particular case, I will be able to provide you with the name of the attorney handling the case.

As of October 18, 2012, there are six cases, which can be divided into the following categories:

Circuit Court Cases (3)

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CIRCUIT COURT CASES

Case No. 1:

<u>Issue</u> – Member received disability benefits following a motor vehicle accident while on duty.

<u>Summary</u> – ETF provided the member with income continuation, duty disability, and disability retirement benefits for the injuries the member sustained in the accident. Thus, ETF may have a subrogation interest in this matter, depending on how the case is resolved.

<u>Status</u> – ETF followed the advice of its DOJ attorney to resolve this matter by accepting a settlement check representing nearly all of its subrogation interest, thereby avoiding the uncertainty and expense of further litigation. The matter now is resolved.

<u>Attorney</u> – DOJ attorney.

Case No. 2:

<u>Issue</u> – Insurance provider denied payment for a specified service.

<u>Summary</u> – ETF determined the insurance provider had acted within its discretion under the contract and did not exceed its authority in denying payment of coverage for service. The member also has asserted he was the victim of discrimination and retaliation.

Status – The parties have filed briefs with the court and are awaiting a decision.

<u>Attorney</u> – DOJ attorney.

Case No. 3:

<u>Issue</u> – Which party is entitled, under the applicable law, to the life insurance and retirement death benefits of the deceased WRS member.

<u>Summary</u> – The wife and sister of the deceased are involved in litigation to determine who is legally entitled to the life insurance and retirement death benefits. ETF was named as a defendant, in an effort to prevent the death benefits from being paid. ETF informed the parties and the court that no payments will be made until the case is resolved.

Status – The parties are involved in discussions. No court activity is scheduled.

<u>Attorney</u> – DOJ attorney.

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SUBROGATION CASES

WPS has retained private counsel to handle these cases. No ETF or DOJ attorney is involved in these cases. There are three cases pending in which GIB or ETF has a subrogation interest in an action filed in circuit court by a WRS member because ETF provided benefits to that member following a personal injury.
