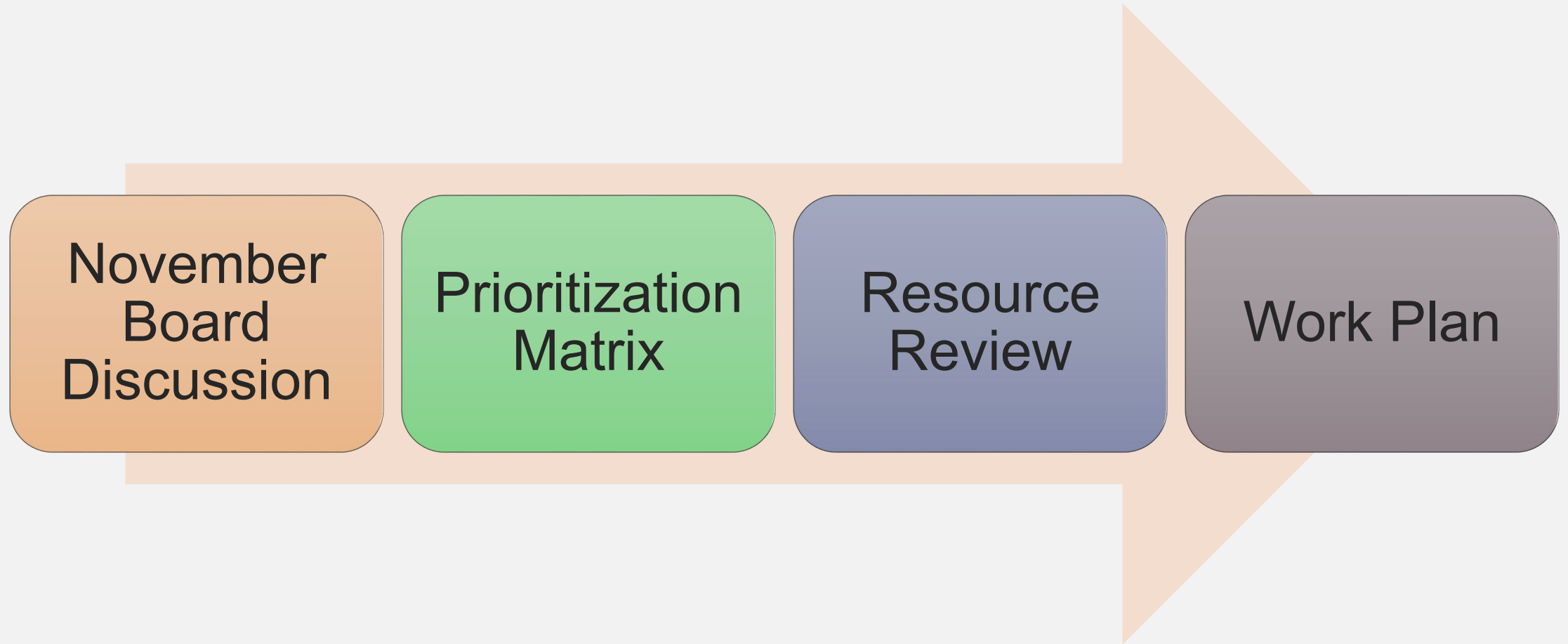

# Key Initiative Details

## Onsite Clinics

- Review is under way and will be presented at May 2020 meeting
- Review will cover clinic efficacy, population consideration, and legal and logistics affecting implementation

## Avoidable ER Use

- IBM Watson Health noted inappropriate use is best addressed through education
- ETF proposes two-part approach:
  - Education campaign
  - Possible provider access intervention

## Long-Term Initiatives

- Other work related to initiatives will have an official scope of analysis
- ETF could present initial scope statements at first meeting following the start of work

# Triple Aim Evaluation

- All initiatives will be presented with evaluation of Triple Aim impact
- Rubric provided to assist in analysis
