Dear Matt Larson,

Thank you for your email dated January 8, 2025, to the Department of Employee Trust Funds (ETF) and the Group Insurance Board (Board) expressing your desire to have alternative dental insurance options beyond Delta Dental (Delta) as the sole offering.

You stated that your dental office has stopped accepting Delta, in part due to the low reimbursement levels. You also state that you are aware of other individuals in your community also looking for new dental office recommendations due to similar circumstances.

I understand your concern about having to search for a new provider due to your current dental provider's decision to cancel their contract with Delta.

The challenge of dental providers not accepting certain insurances is an industry-wide issue, not limited to Wisconsin or Delta. In February 2023, Delta increased reimbursement rates for frequently performed dental procedures, which benefited over 75% of general dentists in Wisconsin. Delta again made an upward adjustment to provider reimbursement rates for all dental codes effective January 1, 2025. These adjustments were based on a marketplace review.

Unfortunately, some providers are choosing to withdraw from all networks. According to the American Dental Association Health Policy Institute's <u>February 2023</u> report, 16% of dental providers dropped out of any network in the preceding two months, with an additional 21% expected to do so in the following three months.

The Delta PPO Plus Premier network includes 88% of all providers in the state, and the number of providers contracted with Delta is nearly double that of any other carrier network. Delta's annual network retention rate for state providers stands at 98%.

The Board's process of contracting with a particular vendor to provide benefits to members involves a rigorous Request for Proposal (RFP) process. After soliciting proposals from any potential vendors, the submitted RFPs are reviewed and evaluated by ETF, state, and local employers, with the Board ultimately making the final decision as to which vendor to contract with. You can find the Board's most recent RFP request for a vendor to administer the Uniform Dental Benefit (UDB) here.

At the <u>November 13, 2024,</u> Board meeting, the Board approved the extension of the UDB contract with Delta to run through December 31, 2028.
