Protective County Jailers



What is 2023 Wisconsin Act 4?

Effective January 1, 2024

- County correctional officers (jailers) who are categorized as general employees will become protective occupation employees under the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS), unless they opt out
- Affects current employees and future hires

Creates New Employment Category

Act 4 Protective County Jailers

Employment Categories Comparison

Category Factors	General Members	Act 4 Protective County Jailers
Minimum Retirement Age (MRA)	55	50
Normal Retirement Age (NRA)	65	54
Formula Calculation Factor	.016	.020
Disability Insurance	40.63 only	Duty Disability (employee paid)
Employee Contribution	6.9%	14.3%*
Employer Contribution	6.9%	6.9%

^{*}Rates may be different for employees who have collective bargaining agreements or if made pre-tax or post-tax (depending on employer)





Breakdown the differences in factors



Employee Contribution

- For 2024, Act 4 Protective County Jailers employees contribute 14.3% of salary
- Factors that affect this contribution amount:
 - Rates may be different for employees who have collective bargaining agreements
 - Rates change yearly

Example	General Employee Pays	Act 4 Protective County Jailer Pays
Earnings: \$60,000 annually	\$4.140	\$8,580
County Duty Disability is .3%	ψ, ιιο	Ψ0,000

Duty Disability

- Act 4 Protective County Jailers pay a premium for the Duty Disability Insurance Program
 - In 2024, this is .02%-.57% of your salary
 - Rates vary from year to year and are determined by your employer

Example	General Employee Pays	Act 4 Protective County Jailer Pays
Earnings: \$60,000 annually	\$0	\$180
	(General employees are not	
County Duty Disability is .3%	eligible for duty disability)	

Pre-Tax or Post-Tax Contributions

 Act 4 Protective County Jailers contributions are made pre-tax or post-tax depending on your date of hire

Your Contributions Will Be Made:	If You Were:
Pre-tax	First hired by a county after the county was impacted by or opted into Act 4
Post-tax	A participating employee at a county before the county was impacted by or opted into Act 4*

General Formula Benefit Calculation

Formula Calculation	Example
Final Average Earnings (Monthly)	\$5,833
Post-1999 General Employee Formula Factor	X .016
Post-1999 General Employee Years of Service	X 28
Post-1999 General Employee Age Reduction Factor (Age 55)	X .891
Annuity Amount ("For Annuitant's Life Only" Option)	= \$2,328



Act 4 Protective County Jailer Formula Benefit Calculation

Formula Calculation	Example
Final Average Earnings (Monthly)	\$5,833
Post-1999 General Employee Formula Factor	X .016
Post-1999 General Employee Years of Service	X 23
Post-1999 General Employee Age Reduction Factor (Age 55)	X .891
General Employee Subtotal	+ \$1,912
Post-1999 Act 4 Protective County Jailer Formula Factor	
Post-1999 Act 4 Protective County Jailer Years of Service	
Post-1999 Act 4 Protective County Jailer Age Reduction Factor (Age 55)	X 1.00
Act 4 Protective County Jailer Subtotal	+ 583
Annuity Amount ("For Annuitant's Life Only" Option)	= \$2,495







WRS Retirement Benefits Calculator

Unofficial estimate of your benefits

Tips for using the calculator

Disclaimer

Run your own numbers multiple ways



This WRS Retirement Benefits Calculator is a tool that can give you an unofficial estimate of your benefit as you plan for retirement. Contact ETF for your official estimate and application 6-12 months before you plan to apply for benefits.

- You must be vested and at least age 55 as of your benefit begin date (or age 50 if you have earned -not purchased-WRS service in a protective occupation).
- Your benefit will be based on the higher of a "Money Purchase" or "Formula" calculation. This calculator is set up to
 estimate retirement benefits under both methods. It does not use information from your account. You must enter all the
 related information for it to provide your highest benefit estimate.







Decision Deadlines



Complete ET-2440 and submit to your employer by the deadline in this table:

You are:	Deadline
A county jailer working in a county that categorized its jailers as general employees before January 1, 2024	March 1, 2024
First hired on or after January 1, 2024, at a county that is impacted by or opted into Act 4	Within 60 days of hire



Your Decision is Permanent

Cannot Change Employment Category

 After the deadline to make your decision has passed, you cannot change your employment category if you remain a jailer with your current employer



Automatically Categorized as Act 4 Protective County Jailer

If you do nothing, you will be categorized as an Act 4
 protective county jailer which will affect your take-home pay,
 retirement benefits, and duty disability insurance eligibility






