

Your health check options.

1. BIOMETRIC SCREENING. Go to webmdhealth.com/wellwisconsin and click "Get Started" on the Biometric Screening card. From there, you have three screening options.

Onsite screening event.

Click under "Onsite Health Screening" to be directed to the Quest site, find a screening near you and reserve your spot.

At-home test kit.

Request a kit by clicking under "Home Test Kit" and ordering on the Quest site.

Health Care Provider Form.

Download the fillable form by clicking under "Health Care Provider Form."

- **2. DENTAL CLEANING.** Complete a routine dental cleaning visit between October 1, 2020, and October 8, 2021. Report your completion on **webmdhealth.com/wellwisconsin** by clicking "Rewards" and then, next to Health Check, clicking "more." Enter your cleaning date and click "save" in the Annual Dental Cleaning activity.
- **3. COACHING SESSION.** You have two options for coaching interactions.

Complete one call with a WebMD health coach by calling **800-821-6591**.

Complete a series of online messaging interactions by clicking "Coaching" on **webmdhealth.com/wellwisconsin**.

Complete the other two Well Wisconsin activities for a \$150 gift card.

*The Well Wisconsin incentive program is a voluntary program available to employees, retirees and spouses enrolled in the State of Wisconsin Group Health Insurance Program, excluding Medicare Advantage participants who have incentives available through their health plan. The Well Wisconsin incentive will automatically be issued to eligible participants upon completing the applicable activities. All wellness incentives paid to participants are considered taxable income to the group health plan subscriber and are reported to their employer, who will issue a W2. In some cases, the Wisconsin Retirement System acts as the employer. Retirees, continuants and their spouses will have some taxes withheld from the incentive amount earned.
