





Primary Care

This is same-day or routine care for established patients. Areas of primary care include the following.

- Annual wellness visits and physicals
- Coughs and colds
- Lab work and vaccinations

- General concerns
- Sore throats
- Fever



Urgent Care

Urgent care is for an unexpected injury or illness that is not life threatening, but still needs attention quickly so it doesn't develop into a serious problem. If you're unable to see your primary care physician, urgent care can help with these types of medical issues.



- Minor sprains, strains and fractures
- Persistent vomiting or diarrhea
- Cuts requiring stitches

Virtual Care

Virtual care options are available now more than ever, contact your personal doctor directly for his or her availability. Sometimes, you may have a non-emergency question or illness when your personal doctor is unavailable. When this occurs, Network Health, in partnership with our providers, offers options for non-emergent care that are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.



Emergency Care

An emergency is an illness, injury, symptom or condition so serious, that a reasonable person would seek care right away to avoid serious harm. Emergency care conditions include the following.

Emergency room costs can cost up to seven times more than other care

- Chest pain
- Sudden numbness in an arm or leg
- Trouble breathing
- Head or neck injury
- Severe burns

- Access to virtual, online doctor visits through MDLIVE.
- Connect with a board-certified physician or pediatrician for treatment of a wide range of medical and behavioral health conditions.





How to Use Your HMO

Your plan is a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO)

- You have to use in-network doctors, hospitals, clinics and specialists for services to be covered under your health plan.
- If you use an out-of-network facility or provider for health care services, you will be financially responsible for the full cost of the services unless you receive prior authorization from Network Health.
- HMO plans do not cover out-of-network care, except in an emergency.

Please Note – Both provider AND the provider facility must be innetwork and located in Network Health's service area for medical services to be covered by your Network Health benefits plan



What's Changing in 2025

- Nutritional counseling coverage to allow for services related to weight management
- Expanded lifetime limit on Orthoptic Eye Training from two to twelve
- Maximum Out of Pocket Changes adjustment for federal limits (\$9450/18900 to 9200/18400)
- High Deductible Health Plan deductible adjustment for federal requirements (\$1600/\$3200 to \$1650/\$3300)



What's New in 2025

- ThedaCare is an in-network participating provider.
- Pilot Program Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM)
 - For State of Wisconsin members, we offer a "pilot" program to help access the care you need to be well. This program is not part of uniform benefits and is unique to Network Health. Pilot program is subject to change without notice.

Network Health is offering a new pilot program for Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM) visits and devices for managing obesity, hypertension, sleep apnea and atrial fibrillation. The program reduces member cost-share to \$0 for RPM visits and devices, helping you manage their condition more efficiently and effectively.
