



Attend an OnSite Biometric Screening

Who can attend: All employees, spouses and retirees who are enrolled in the State of Wisconsin Group Health Insurance Program

Measurements & tests include:

- Blood pressure
- Height, weight, waist, body mass index (BMI)
- Total cholesterol (HDL, LDL, triglycerides)
- Blood glucose

What to expect:

- A quick, 15-minute appointment
- Fingertick blood sample collection
- Fasting is recommended, but not required
- You'll get your results within 90 seconds of your sample collection
- A consultation of your results is included

Take the next step:

- Be sure to discuss your results with your primary care provider
- A screening counts as your health check! Complete the health assessment and a well-being activity by October 17, 2025, to earn a \$150* prepaid card.



HOW TO REGISTER

Go to webmdhealth.com/wellwisconsin and click "Benefits." On the Biometric Screening card, click "Get Started." Under "Onsite Health Screening" click to register and you will be directed to the Quest site. Find a screening near you to reserve your spot or request a self-collection kit if you cannot attend one of the onsite events.

*The Well Wisconsin incentive program is a voluntary program available to employees, retirees and spouses enrolled in the State of Wisconsin Group Health Insurance Program, excluding Medicare Advantage participants who have incentives available through their health plan. The Well Wisconsin incentive will automatically be issued to eligible participants upon completing the applicable activities. All wellness incentives paid to participants are considered taxable income to the group health plan subscriber and are reported to their employer, who will issue a W2. In some cases, the Wisconsin Retirement System acts as the employer. Retirees, continuants and their spouses will have some taxes withheld from the incentive amount earned.
